Chair	John Bitter: 1. Thanks all the Board members who have worked with him to get a lot of things done. 2. Issues and things to explore and work on: a. Governance Committee: to look into Pacific Swimming hiring an Executive Director or Office Manager ( we are big enough, and have sufficient funds such that this may be a move that will be very beneficial – especially as it seems finding dedicated volunteers is getting harder not only for our LSC but all over the country) b. Continue to work on how to use our office staff – we have experienced growing pains and are		

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	<p>getting better and better at it.</p> <p>c. Annie Stein has stepped in to handle sanctions and this has already shown a positive impact</p> <p>d. John will try to focus on finishing up these tasks in the next year, before his term ends.</p>		
<b>Vice Chair – Program Operation</b>	<p>Leo Lin: Reports on the USA –Swimming Convention, September 2014</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. John Bitter has been elected Program Development Technical VP for United States Swimming</li> <li>2. Any By-Law changes must be brought before the HOD. Because some of these mandated changes have just occurred and we do not have another HOD meeting until next May, the plan is to write in these changes in our Policy and Procedures and run them through the BOD, so the changes can be made. They will then be brought before the May HOD for approval as changes in our by-laws.</li> <li>3. USA-S mandates that the Zone BORs begin to function, and the LSC BOR will change its role and function <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. The Zone BOR will run like a court proceeding, including the use of rules of discovery and deal with all code of conduct issues, and any issues that are serious</li> <li>b. When a Zone BOR is called it will consist of 3 persons, none of whom will come from the LSC which is involved in the case in order to bring equity to the BOR</li> <li>c. The LSC BOR will become an Administrative BOR dealing with all issues that are not code of conduct or serious.</li> <li>d. These changes are mandated and will mandate changes in our By-Laws regarding the BOR</li> </ol> </li> <li>4. LSC BOD quorums have been defined as a majority of members of the BOD, not the majority of members present at the meeting</li> <li>5. Administrative Vice Chairs should be the liaison with the Athlete members of the BOD – in our case we have already complied with this. Our Vice Chair – Program Development is the liaison person.</li> <li>6. Transgender issues are being reviewed by a USA Swimming Task Force because the IOC and Masters rules may not be easily applied with our Age Group Swimmers, as those require that the swimmer have completed the surgery and hormone treatment for at least 2 years. We are dealing with much younger swimmers such as 10 year old kids who have not reached puberty yet.</li> <li>7. Sanctioned meet sheets will have to indicate that deck changing will be “prohibited” after January 2015. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. This motion was brought up by an athlete and was a fairly emotionally charged issue</li> <li>b. However, there has been no defined penalty and no clear definition of what “deck changing” is</li> <li>c. The Official's committee has indicated that this is not a “rules” infraction, but rather a sanction's issue. Officials will not take on the role of Deck Changing police.</li> </ol> </li> </ol>

Sectional Times will be a little slower this year and the committee is considering opening the sectionals to swimmers outside the sectional area</li> <li>8. The Japanese Exchange meet will take place in the US on February 7, and is now open for coach applications</li> <li>9. Travel stipends have been approved</li> <li>10. 40,000 swimmers were serviced by us this past year</li> <li>11. Legends Meet will be added to the USA-S Schedule and the qualifying times will be between Sectional Times and Junior National Times.</li> <li>12. <b>Officials</b>	Brian Malick: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Today's clinic had over 280 Officials participating</li> <li>2. The invited speakers that were from out of our LSC were very well received</li> <li>3. We need to continue to have more out of our LSC speakers</li> <li>4. Dan McAllen, the new Vice Chair Operations is very much in support of this</li> </ol>

<b>Time Standards</b>	Tish Steimle: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. See Report</li> <li>2. She voices concerns about the sudden jump to using AAA times for the Far Westerns and the AA for JOs. Given the present data, the 12 &amp; under boys will have very few swimmers making JOS</li> <li>3. Tish strongly advocates that we rethink this change in qualifications for this year. ( The BOD has just passed a ruling which enables the changes to Far Western and JO qualifying times this year, provided the host teams agree to the change</li> <li>4. Tish advocates we continue to make the changes more gradually.</li> <li>5. Jim Morefield echoes these concerns.</li> <li>6. Clint Benton indicated that usually when you make changes you do one at a time so you can figure out the specific impacts of the changes. Right now we are making multiple changes – adoption of USA motivational times, change in Far Western and JOs times, no consideration, for example, of BB times and the loss of 8&amp;U times.</li> </ol>	Age Group to revisit the change in qualifications times for JOs and Far Westerns before the letters are sent to the host teams in the next two weeks.	

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	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>7. John Bitter reports that we have agreed to maintain the Pacific 8&amp;U times.</li> <li>8. John Bitter recommends that given the data Tish has indicated the Age Group Committee revisit the changes in qualification times for JOs and Far Westerns before letters are sent out to the host teams regarding their agreement or disagreement to the change in qualification times this year.</li> </ol>

Darryl reports he proposed this because most athletes don't seem to pay the \$25 fine. By introducing this procedure it will lighten Jill Rupenstein's load.</li> <li>2. This procedure is used by some other LSCs.</li> <li>3. Steve Morisilli wondered why because Pacific has difficulty collecting the money, the clubs were expected to handle that responsibility?</li> <li>4. Marie Lin suggested that we follow through with our present process, which we have yet to do, before changing the process.</li> <li>5. There was concern that clubs would be placed in between the swimmer and Pacific Swimming and the only recourse for clubs to recoup the funds would be to withhold training of the swimmer, something they would not be willing to do.</li> <li>6. The fine is incurred by the swimmer and is likely to occur without the knowledge of the club or coach, so they should not be forced to be responsible for paying the fine.</li> <li>7. It was asked what would happen if the club refused to pay? Would we then take the club to the Board of Review?</li> <li>8. Because of the Ted Stevens act, no swimmer could be deprived of the right to swim without a fair hearing so they would need to be brought before the BOR before they could be prohibited from swimming because of not paying a fine.</li> </ol> <p>Amendment: Increase the first fine to \$100, the second fine to \$150, and remove all the statements regarding having the swimmer's club involved in the fining process. <b>Presentation of Annual Budget</b>	Budget presented by Leo Lin (Peggy Ramirez excused) Items pulled: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 12500 Age Group Programs – Pacific Coast (actual costs will be lower so the figure recovered from copay is lowered) to \$7040 –passed</li> <li>2. 52000 National/Senior Program – International All Star Meet (Japanese Exchange) – cost will be \$30,000 rather than \$20,000 – passed</li> <li>3. 54000 Age Group Programs – Pacific Coast (actual costs will be lowered so the expenses will be decreased) to \$14,900 – passed</li> </ol> Note there was concern regarding how much Pacific is paying for the Japanese Exchange Program <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Last year Japan covered all the costs for housing and feeding the swimmers when they were in Japan. It only cost Pacific \$15,000 to cover airline expenses.</li> <li>2. This year the USA is hosting it and it is expected that SoCal will contribute \$30,000, and Pacific will contribute \$30,000. The other LSCs will contribute the rest. It is anticipated that the cost will be \$70,000 or \$71,000.</li> <li>3. Last year Pacific sent 4 swimmers. If it is the same number this year we are paying something like \$7000 plus per swimmer.</li> <li>4. We may want to consider if there is sufficient value for the expense, for us to commit further to this program, once we finish the present two year cycle.</li> </ol>	Budget passed
