We have not been in compliance with that rule for many years. Brian reports that we need to come into compliance. a. This will start with this year's Far Western's Long Course b. Brian will send out word to officials and all the coaches so that the swimmers will be prepared to expect the enforcement of the USA rule. c. Swimmer's will be expected to swim in finals if they are seeded in finals unless they have been medically excused. Sitting on the blocks will no longer be accepted as a valid excuse. d. Swimmers selected, who subsequently change their mind and withdraw, will have the "no refund" policy applied so that they would forfeit all the fees, including the co-pay and this application fee. So members were concerned about the fees being applied for swimmers who would not know what their specific competition was when applying, and who would have definitely not applied if they had knowledge that they clearly were not competitive.
