I will win with humility and lose with dignity. I will treat every athlete fairly, justly, impartially, intelligently, and with sensitivity. I will continue to seek and maintain my own professional development in all areas in relation to coaching and teaching children. I will always maintain a professional separation between coach and athlete.
