Expectations and Good Traits of a CJ

- Be organized and flexible
- Use your interpersonal skills
- Be knowledgeable (USA Swimming Rules)
- Have a deck presence
- Mentor your Stroke & Turn team
- Smile! Have fun
- Remember: We are all volunteers
- Check your disposition & temperament(are you calm?)
- Engage your perspective (are you looking at things fairly? are you giving the benefit of the doubt?)
- Act and look professional

Review Preparation: Before the Meet

- Review the Stroke & Turn Rules (USA Swimming Rule Book)
- Review the Meet Sheet
- Provide the Stroke & Turn sign-in sheet (See appendix)
- Review officials' credentials
- Know when and where the official's meeting is held
- Assign Teams (may discuss with the Meet Referee)
- Assign the Assistant Chief Judge
- Conduct CJ Duties:
 - Official Meeting,
 - Give out Stroke and Turn assignments, rotations & jurisdictions



PCIFIC SWIMMING

- Arrive Early
- Get to know venue
- Briefly meet with:
 - Meet Referee
 - Hospitality Dir
 - Meet Dir

Review Activities: During the Meet

Observe & Mentor the Stroke & Turn team: Are they in the best position to observe the athletes

- Action: When Stroke & Turn raises a hand:
 - Remember the 3 questions: where were you? What did you see? What it the rule infraction?
 - Ask them to describe what they saw ("paint you a picture") & to note the rule infraction

Observe the Timers:

- Action: Watch their actions
 - Are they at the edge?
 - Are they up in time for the finish?
 - Note: watch for parent photography around the timers

Other Observations/Actions:

- Pass all disqualifications (DQs) to the Deck Referee
- Don't discuss DQs with athletes or parents (politely direct them to the coach)
- Be ready for challenges from the coaches
- Evaluate Stroke & Turns (written and unwritten) (Sample in Appendix)

Review Steps & Actions: After the Meet



- Thank everyone for volunteering
- Start or complete the evaluations for your Stroke & Turn team
- Remember to review your evaluations with the Meet Referee prior to presenting to the Stroke & Turn official
