Please anticipate the venue to be crowded, including on the pool deck and in participant set-up areas. Face covering requirements during the meet will be subject to the facility's mandates at the time of the meet. All participants and spectators are encouraged to wear a face covering within a crowd or when physical distancing isn't possible, particularly for those unvaccinated against COVID-19. The competition and warm-up areas are outdoors but having many people in close proximity (including under pop-up shelters) is an inherent risk for potential exposure to COVID-19.

Facility Requirements (as of December 2021): Face covering is **mandatory** in all indoor areas, including locker rooms/restrooms, office areas, and hospitality. Face covering is optional in all outdoor areas.

No Friday night set-up is permitted. The facility will open for admission at 7:00 AM on Saturday and Sunday.

SANCTION: Held under USA/Pacific Swimming Sanction No. **22-012**

In granting this sanction it is understood and agreed that USA Swimming shall be free from any liabilities or claims for damages arising by reason of injuries to anyone during the conduct of the event.

ZONE CHALLENGE MEET SELECTION: This is a SELECTION MEET for the Pacific Swimming Zone Challenge Meet (formerly Zone All-Star Meet/ZAM) on February 27, 2022, at Dougherty Valley Aquatics Center (San Ramon, CA). The **Zone 2 Challenge Team** will be comprised of up to eight girls and eight boys from each of four age groups (8 & under, 9–10, 11–12, 13–14) for a total of up to 64 athletes. The selection for seven athletes in each gender of each age group will be determined by the total number of points scored in the following six selection events:

To be considered for the Zone 2 Challenge Team, each applicant (or their parent/legal guardian) must perform the following **two (2)** steps:

- a. **Enter and compete** in *at least one* of the six selection events listed in the table above at this Zone 2 Championship meet.
(Note: Competing in more selection events increases the chance of selection. Age group for Zone Challenge team selection is based on the athlete's age on February 27, 2022)
- b. **Complete and submit** the "Letter of Intent" online no later than **Wednesday, January 26, 2022, at 11:59 PM.**

Only times achieved at the 2022 Zone 2 Championship Meet will be considered for selection. Points will be scored based on the applicant's age group on February 27, 2022. More information can be found at <https://zone2challenge2022.eventbrite.com/>.

USE OF AUDIO AND VISUAL: Photography and video recording from behind the blocks or starting areas is prohibited unless prior permission is granted by the Meet Referee. Use of any audio or visual recording devices, including but not limited to film and digital cameras, cell phones and tablets, and Google Glass is not permitted in changing areas, restrooms, or locker rooms. Violation of this recording prohibition may result in ejection from the swimming pool facility by the Meet Referee or their designee.

LOCATION: Soda Aquatic Center at Campolindo High School. 300 Moraga Road, Moraga, California 94556.

DIRECTIONS: From **CA-24 E**, take exit 9 (Orinda/Moraga) and turn right onto Camino Pablo, then continue straight onto Moraga Way. In 1.3 miles, turn left onto Glorietta Blvd, then in 0.6 mi turn right onto Rheem Blvd. In 2.3 mi, turn left onto Moraga Road. In 0.6 mi, turn left onto Campolindo Drive. Campolindo Parking Lot will be on the left (700 ft). From **CA-24 W**, take exit 13 (Central Lafayette/Moraga). Turn right onto Deer Hill Road, then turn right onto First Street. In 0.2 miles, turn right onto Mt Diablo Blvd, then turn left onto Moraga Road. In 2.2 miles, turn right onto Campolindo Drive. Campolindo Parking Lot will be on the left (700 ft).

PARKING: Parking available at the Campolindo Parking Lot. On-street parking allowed on the west side of Moraga Rd and on the south side of Campolindo Drive. Local parking laws will be enforced by ticketing or towing. No parking in Carroll Ranch, where streets are privately owned. No parking where 'No Parking' or 'Permit Parking Only' signs are posted. No parking in permit-only, handicap, residential, or otherwise reserved spots without proper parking permit or placard. No overnight/RV parking allowed.

COURSE: Outdoor 25 yd × 50 m pool with up to 18 lanes for competition. The minimum water depth for the shallow-end course, measured in accordance with Article 103.2.3 is 10 ft on the west end and 7 ft on the east end of the competition pool. The competition course has been certified in accordance with Article 104.2.2C(4). The copy of such certification is on file with USA Swimming. A separate eight lane, 25 yd warm-up pool will be available throughout the meet.

TIME: Meet begins at 9:00 AM each day. General warm-up from 7:30–8:45 AM each day. A special warm-up time for 8 & under athletes only held from 8:45–8:55 AM.

RULES: • Current USA Swimming and Pacific Swimming rules and warm-up procedures will govern the meet. A copy of these procedures will be posted at the Clerk of Course.

- The local facility guidelines, restrictions, and interpretation of the local public health guidelines shall be followed at this meet.
- All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy ("MAAPP"), and that they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the conduct of this competition.
- All events are timed finals.
- All events will swim fast to slow.
- Athletes may compete in up to **four (4) individual events** per day, plus relays.
- All athletes 12 years and younger should complete competition in four (4) hours or less per session.
- Entries will be accepted until the number of splashes exceeds the estimated timeline, per the "Four-Hour Rule", based on the athletes' age and gender.
- If local conditions warrant it, the Meet Referee, with the concurrence of the Meet Director, may require a mandatory scratch down. Immediate cash refunds will be made for any mandatory scratches.
- Unattached athletes do not represent a club and may not score points for a club. Unattached athletes may score points for the purpose of the individual high-point awards.
- Relay teams shall not compete unattached. Unattached athletes are not eligible to be relay team members.
- **All coaches and deck officials must wear their USA Swimming membership card in a visible manner.**

UNACCOMPANIED ATHLETES: Any USA-S athlete-member competing at the meet must be accompanied by a USA Swimming member-coach for the purposes of athlete supervision during warm-up, competition, and warm-down. If a coach-member of the athlete's USA-S Club does not attend the meet to serve in said supervisory capacity, it is the responsibility of the athlete or the athlete's parent/legal guardian to arrange for supervision by a USA-S member-coach. The Meet Director or Meet Referee may assist the athlete in making arrangements for such supervision; however, it is recommended that such arrangements be made in advance of the meet by the athlete's USA-S Club Member-Coach.

RACING STARTS: Any athlete entered in the meet must be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the athlete or the athlete's parent/legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.

RESTRICTIONS: • Smoking and use of other tobacco products is prohibited in all areas of the venue, including the pool, spectator area, team areas within the pool facility (e.g., portion of the building designated for teams and athletes, or fenced area around an outdoor pool), locker rooms, and such other areas as may be specifically designated by the host club or organization, meet director, or referee.

- Sale and use of alcoholic beverages are prohibited in all areas of the venue.
- No glass containers are allowed in the venue.
- No propane heater is permitted, except for snack bar and meet operations.
- Only timer and coach shelters will be allowed on the pool deck around the sides and ends of the pool.
- All shelters must be properly secured.
- Deck changes are prohibited.
- Destructive devices, to include but not limited to, explosive devices and equipment, firearms (open or concealed), blades, knives, mace, stun guns and blunt objects are strictly prohibited in the swimming facility and its surrounding areas. If observed, the Meet Referee or their designee may ask that these devices be stored safely away from the public or removed from the facility. Noncompliance may result in the reporting to law enforcement authorities and ejection from the facility. Law enforcement officers are exempt per applicable laws.
- Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open-ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.

ELIGIBILITY: • Athletes must be current (2022) members of USA-S and enter their name and registration number on the meet entry card as they are shown on their Registration Card. If this is not done, it may be difficult to match the athlete with the registration and times database. The meet host will check all athlete registrations against the SWIMS database and if not found to be registered, the Meet Director shall accept the registration at the meet (a \$10 surcharge will be added to the regular registration fee). Duplicate registrations will be refunded by mail.

- Athletes must be attached to a Pacific Swimming **Zone 2 club** or be competing unattached while practicing with a Zone 2 club, pursuant to Article 203.3.
 - **NOTE: Athletes who falsify their entry form by listing a club to which they are not legitimately associated will be rejected from the meet. Further, entry fees will not be refunded, and they may be referred to the Pacific Swimming Administrative Review Committee for disciplinary action.**
- The 2022 Zone 2 Championship minimum time standard is the "B"-minimum USA Swimming 2021–2024 National Age Group Motivational Time for 9–10, 11–12, 13–14, and 15–18 events and is the "PC-B"-minimum Pacific Swimming 8/Under Time Standard for 8 & under events.

- Athletes aged 19 years or older may compete in the meet in the 15–18 age group for time-only, no awards. Such athletes must have met the standards for the 17–18 age group and may not compete in relays or score points.
- Entries with **"NO TIME"** will be **rejected**.
- Entry times submitted for this meet may be checked against a computer database and may be changed in accordance with Pacific Swimming Entry Time Verification Procedures.
- Athletes with a disability are welcome to attend this meet and should contact the Meet Director or Meet Referee regarding any special accommodations on entry times and seeding per Pacific Swimming policy.
- The athlete's age will be the athlete's age on the first day of the meet.

ENTRY FEE: Individual entry fee is \$4.50 per individual event plus an \$8.00 participation fee per athlete. Relay entry fee is \$9.00 per relay entry and must be paid by check accompanying the relay entry form.

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS ENTRIES: Individual events entries will not be accepted earlier than December 20, 2021. Individual events may be entered for this meet online or by mail/hand-delivery. Online meet entry is in no way required or expected in order to enter this meet. Only club coaches may enter relays for their club.

RELAY ENTRIES: All relay entries must be submitted by the club coach or by the Zone 2 contact either online at <https://ome.swimconnection.com/pc/Z220220129> or using the attached Relay Entry form with accompanying club check for the amount due. Make check payable to **Pacific Swimming Zone 2**. Relay entries must be postmarked on or before **Monday, January 17, 2022**, or hand-delivered before **Wednesday January 19, 2022, 4:30 PM**. The 8 & under relay events are being offered in a "Combined" format, permitting entries of girls, boys, or mixed relays which will be seeded by entry time and swum together.

RELAY-ONLY ATHLETES: In order to verify athlete registration, all relay athletes who are not also entered in at least one individual event in this meet must be entered either online at <https://ome.swimconnection.com/pc/Z220220129> or on the attached "Club Contact Information and Relay Summary" form.

ONLINE ENTRIES: To enter online go to <https://ome.swimconnection.com/pc/Z220220129> to receive an immediate entry confirmation. This method requires payment by credit card. Swim Connection, LLC charges a processing fee for this service, equal to \$1 per athlete plus 5% of the total Entry Fees. Please note that the processing fee is a separate fee from the Entry Fees. If you do not wish to pay the processing fee, enter the meet using a mail entry. Entering online is a convenience, is completely voluntary, and is in no way required or expected of an athlete by Pacific Swimming. Online entries will be accepted through **Wednesday, January 19, 2022, at 11:59 PM**. *Late entries will not be accepted.*

MAILED OR HAND-DELIVERED ENTRIES: Entries must be on the attached Consolidated Entry Form. Forms must be filled out completely and printed clearly with the athlete's best time. Entries must be **postmarked on or before Monday January 17, 2022**, or **hand-delivered before Wednesday January 19, 2022, at 4:30 PM**. *Late entries will not be accepted.* Request for confirmation of receipt of entries should include a self-addressed envelope.

Hand-delivered entries accepted Monday–Friday, 8:30 AM–4:30 PM, except for lunch (12:00–1:00 PM) and holidays. For alternative hand-delivery times, please contact the meet director.

CHECK-IN: The meet will be deck-seeded. Athletes must check in at the Clerk of Course. No event shall be closed more than 30 minutes before the scheduled start of any session. Prior to 10:30 AM, close of check-in for each event shall be no more than 60 minutes before the estimated time of the start of the first heat of the event. **Close of check-in for all remaining events for that day shall be at 10:30 AM.** Athletes who do not check in will not be seeded and will not be allowed to compete in that event. Athletes who wish to scratch from an event after the close of check-in are requested to inform the Referee on the starting end of the competition course.

SCRATCHES: Any athlete not reporting for or competing in an individual timed final event shall not be penalized. Athletes who must withdraw from an event after it is seeded are requested to inform the Referee immediately.

SCORING: The first sixteen (16) places in the individual age group events will be scored and awarded as listed below. The first sixteen places for each relay event will be scored but not awarded.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS: The first sixteen (16) places will be awarded for 8 & under, 9–10, 11–12, 13–14, 15–16, and 17–18 age groups. There will be individual high-point awards for the highest scoring girl and boy in each age group. Any athlete achieving a new

“A” (or “PC-A”) time in an event will be awarded a standard “A” medal, regardless of place achieved in the event. There are no awards for athletes aged 19 years or older. Individual awards must be picked up at the meet. Individual awards will not be mailed or distributed after the meet.

RELAY AWARDS: There are no relay awards.

CLUB AWARDS: Clubs will be divided into three groups based on the number of athletes entered in the meet. The club group assignments will be published with the lane-timing and number of officials requirements. The top three clubs in each group will each receive an award.

ADMISSION: Free. A two-day program will be available for sale at a reasonable price. **No Friday night set-up is permitted.** The facility will open for admission at 7:00 AM on Saturday and Sunday. Facilities will not be provided after meet hours.

SNACK BAR & HOSPITALITY: A snack bar will be available throughout the meet. Coaches and working deck officials will be provided lunch. Hospitality will serve refreshments to timers and volunteers.

EVENT APPAREL: Customized event apparel by **Northwest Designs Ink, Inc.**

MISCELLANEOUS: No overnight parking is allowed. Facilities will not be available after meet hours. Any items left outside the facility fence overnight will not be secured or guarded. Please do not leave anything overnight. Set-up will be available starting at 7:00 AM on the first day of the meet.

TIMERS AND MARSHALS: All participating clubs are expected to provide lane timers based on the number of athletes entered for each day. Club lane-timing assignments will be assigned, and coaches will be notified, during the week prior to the meet. All participating clubs are expected to provide volunteer marshals. Marshalling assignments will be assigned by the Head Meet Marshal, and the club volunteer coordinator or coach will be notified during the week prior to the meet.

MINIMUM OFFICIALS: The Meet Referee shall conduct an inventory of Officials and shall compare the number of athletes entered against the number of Officials that worked representing each club per day of the meet. Those clubs who have not provided sufficient Officials in a day of the meet, in accordance with the table below, shall be fined \$100 per missing Official per day.
